The actual content you are trying to purchase is only 13 pages long. The author has artificially inflated her page count with BLANK pages.Why am I making such a claim? Here is a breakdown of the book's sections to demonstrate my point.Pages 8-20 contains the "100 Effective Ways to Collect Child Support" information. This accounts for 27% (13/48 pages) of the book.Pages 22-31 are ADVERTISEMENTS, including an

advertisement for the book you've just paid for (page 27). This accounts for 21% (10/48 pages) of the book. Pages 32-48 are BLANK. This makes up 35% (17/48 pages) of the book. The pages not mentioned above are things like "about the author", "dedications", the title page, etc. These pages are usually negligible in most books and don't need mentioned. However, in this book, these pages account for 8 of 48 pages, which is 17% of the book! In addition to inflating the page count, the book was poorly edited. Here is an example of the poor editing. "44. Any information you want the attorney to see, you can fax over, or bring it in person. Sometimes the fax numbers or address of this office is difficult to find but if you look at the letterhead and/or call information you will find the address. E-mail me if you still don't have any luck." First, there are simple mistakes that most text editor programs should have pointed out to the author, like how "Your" should have been "You" in the excerpt above. Additionally, the author uses confusing language. "Bring" would imply to send the information to the author. "This office" again implies one should send legal documents to the author. On the other hand, the last sentence says to email the author if you don't have any luck, implying that he is not the person that he was referring to in the previous sentences.
