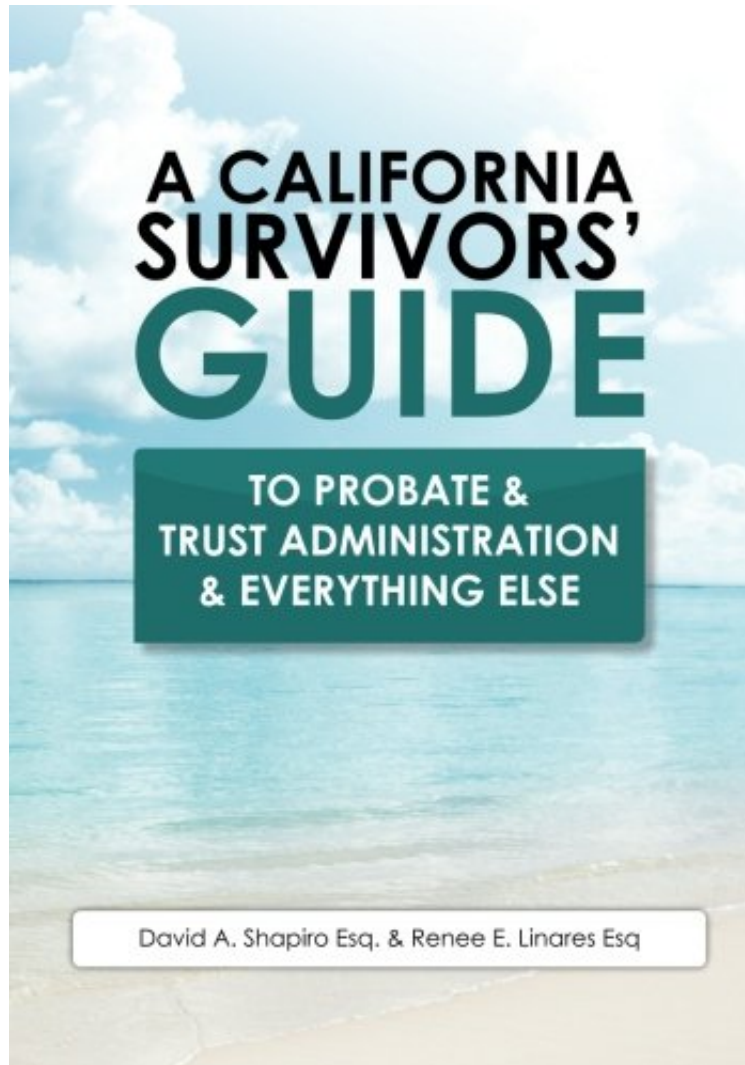

Mostly an overview of what to expect they will want from you when you visit your estate attorney, a qualified attorney, your financial adviser, your accountant, a tax professional, etc. But not much detail about what they will be doing or proposing. Even the tasks the authors think you might handle

are not very well described. Even who "you" are in a specific example (relative? estate representative? successor trustee? beneficiary?) is often not clear. The first section is The Immediate and addresses the concerns from the instant of death up until the burial or cremation. The second section, the Courthouse: Probate and Trust Administration, addresses probate and trust administration and handling guardianships. The third section, Dollars and Sense: Handling the Financial Aspects of the Estate, addresses managing the estate and addresses everything from Social Security Benefits to Taxes and almost everything in between.
