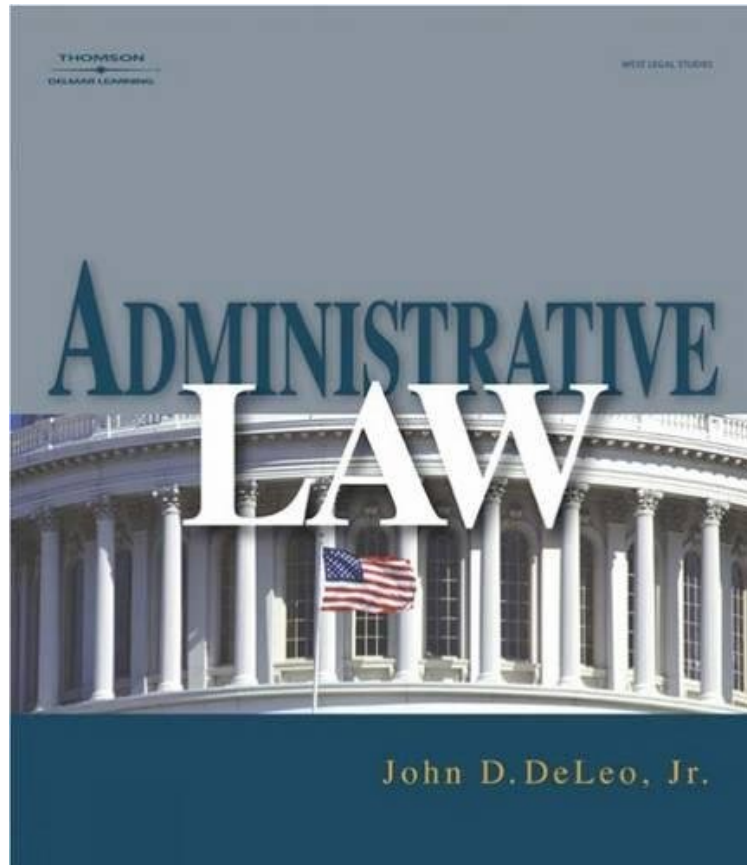

The text is organized into three parts: creation of agencies, what agencies do, and how agencies are controlled. This organization brings

clarity to the subject matter and allows students to focus on individual concepts while not losing sight of the big picture. The emphasis of the text is on the function and control of agency processes, and is presented in a way that shows relevance to the student's every day life, leaving them with a working knowledge of how agencies operate.
