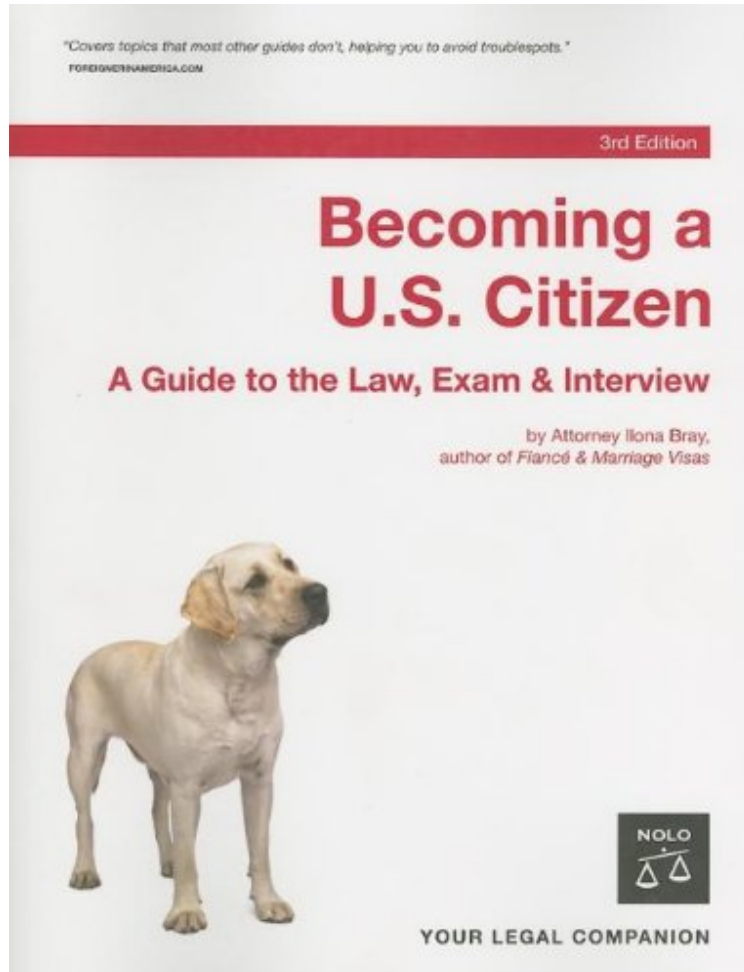

I used the 'How to get a green card' by Nolo and it was wonderful, so I purchased this book to get my citizenship. It was helpful, but as the citizen process is much easier than getting green card, I probably could have completed the application without the help of a book (my situation was very straight forward). As my first language is English, I did not need the questions months in advance and if I had known they would have been provided to me when I did finger printing, I would probably not have bought any book. The pamphlet provided also included an audio CD which is not in the book (the audio would be great for non-English speaking individuals), and an explanation of what is needed to pass the interview. The book did help to explain where to find the most recent names for the local senator and house representative, which was not available in the pamphlet from USCIS so that was handy. But my husband was also handy as he knew how to get the information without the book. So this is a very good and concise book, but if your situation is straight forward, you know English, and you have savvy Americans at your disposal for recent political information, you can do it yourself without the book (especially if you were resourceful enough to do the green card yourself). Otherwise, you may find the investment worth the piece of mind, as you probably want to get it right the first time!
