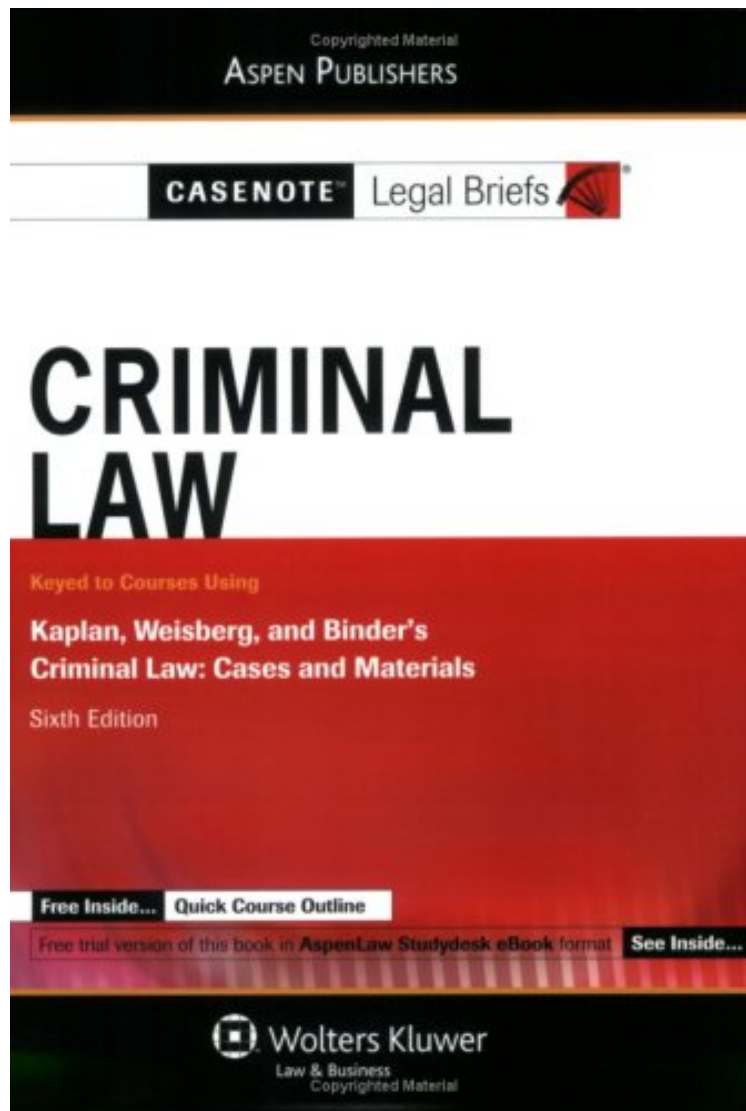

My prof may have been reading this book to us in class. tracked it very well. The book is simply case briefs of the main cases in Criminal Law: Cases and Materials. It does a good job of clearing out useless facts and distilling the case down to the main points. My only concern is the proofreading for a select few collateral laws doesn't match criminal law and is pulled from completely different topics. This doesn't affect the reading though and is more related to side info. I would suggest looking supplements up in the law library and reading a few sections. I used Understanding Criminal Law when Emanuel Law Outlines: Criminal Law and my casebook didn't cover the topics well. I only began using Casenote near the end and really wished I had used it from the start. Emanuel just didn't cut it like the keyed versions, but Casenote and Understanding got me through. I found Siegel's Criminal Law: Essay Multiple Choice Question Answer 2009 (Siegel's Series) far more useful and wish I had used from the start. Also Acing Criminal Law was useful for brief info when outlining and working through outlines. The checklist/flowchart format is remarkably useful.

Many professors do not allow canned briefs so be sure to transcribe the information or use it as a tool to quickly review a case if you are low on time or need a refresher before class. The facts are always accurate, the issue is usually what the professor is looking for, and the holding is also correct. The series also defines legal terms used in the case on the brief. I've used the CaseNote series in every first year class and they made my life a lot easier. Reading cases is important but when you are low on time or need a quick summary this series is fantastic. The book is also perforated so you can tear out the briefs as you need them or scan the page to view on your computer if the professor allows computers in class.
