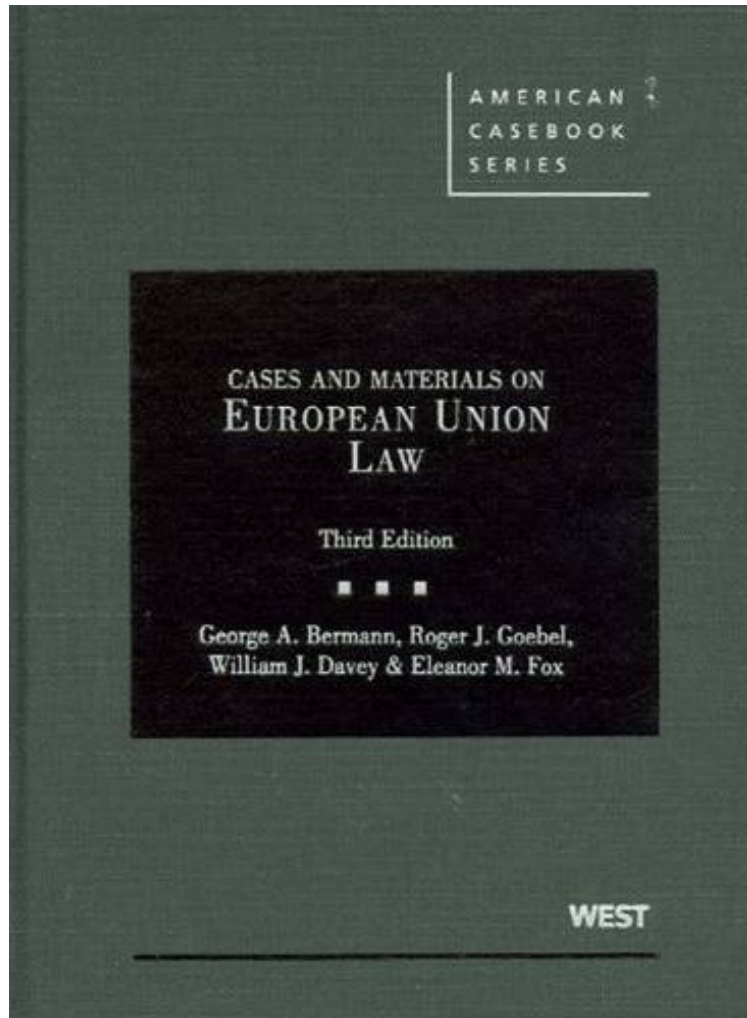

It does an amazing job of presenting a completely foreign legal system in a way that is accessible to American students. The authors demonstrate their very nuanced understanding of the developments in EU caselaw. They also carefully describe the ways in which it continues to evolve, which makes me more optimistic that my knowledge of European law will not be outdated in a few years. I also particularly liked the

There's a lot of good information contained within. My biggest complaint, though, is that there are a lot of references to outdated treaty articles. Typically, the first mention of the old treaty number will have a parenthetical reference to the new treaty article, but subsequent mentions will be to the old one. This might be useful to a professor who has studied EU law for a while. For a law student getting his first taste of EU law, however, this is frustrating. Why clutter the book with outdated information? I will never have a use for the old treaty article so to include such can only lead to confusion. This book is a great example of poor organization and an inability to summarize information in a clear and concise manner. Our instructor admitted that reading the EU Treaties was easier, more informational, and a better use of our time. Bermann, Goebel, Davey, and Fox really show an elementary understanding of organizing information. From the first chapter, the information appears to be cut and pasted with no real understanding of what is being communicated.

This classic casebook reflects the many institutional and substantive changes brought about by the Treaty of Lisbon of December 2009. Divided into seven parts, this casebook allows teachers the flexibility to tailor their courses to their own needs. Parts I and II, respectively, treat the legal/institutional framework of the EU and the enforcement of EU law in the Member States. Part III covers all aspects of the Internal Market and its free movement principles. Part IV comprehensively covers European competition policy, while Part V fully treats the EU's external, including trade, relations and Part VI treats issues surrounding the Euro. Finally, Part VII presents a sampling of EU policy areas e.g., social policy, environmental and consumer protection.
