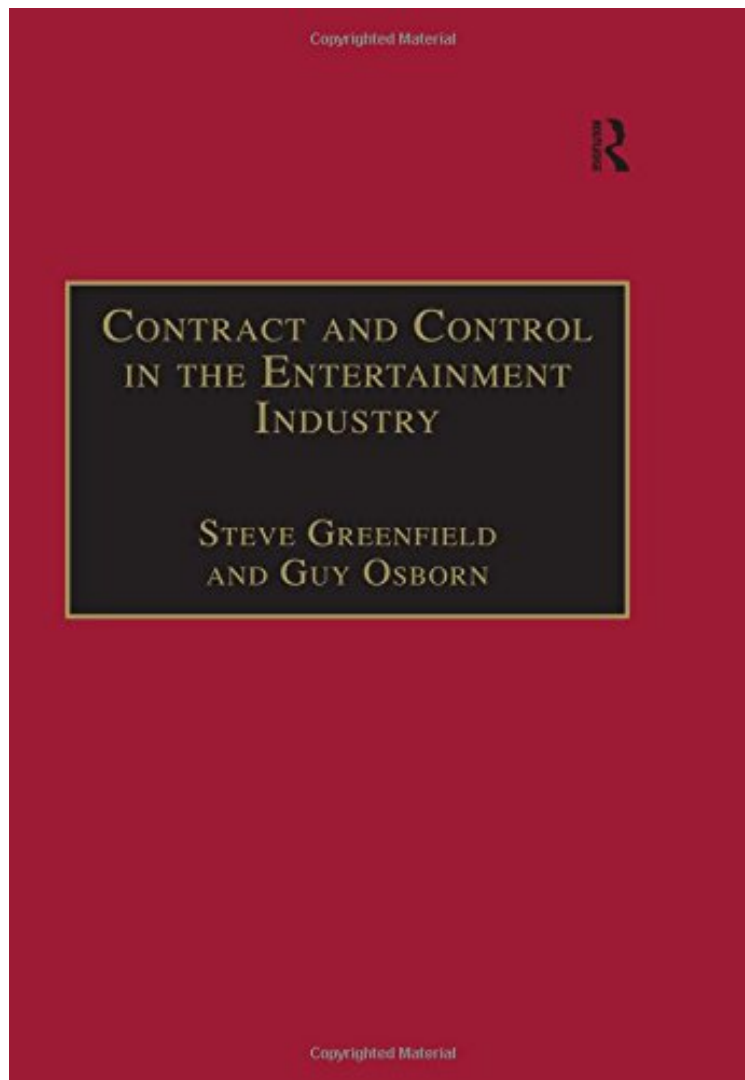


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## **Contract and Control in the Entertainment Industry: Dancing on the Edge of Heaven (Studies in Modern Law and Policy)**
