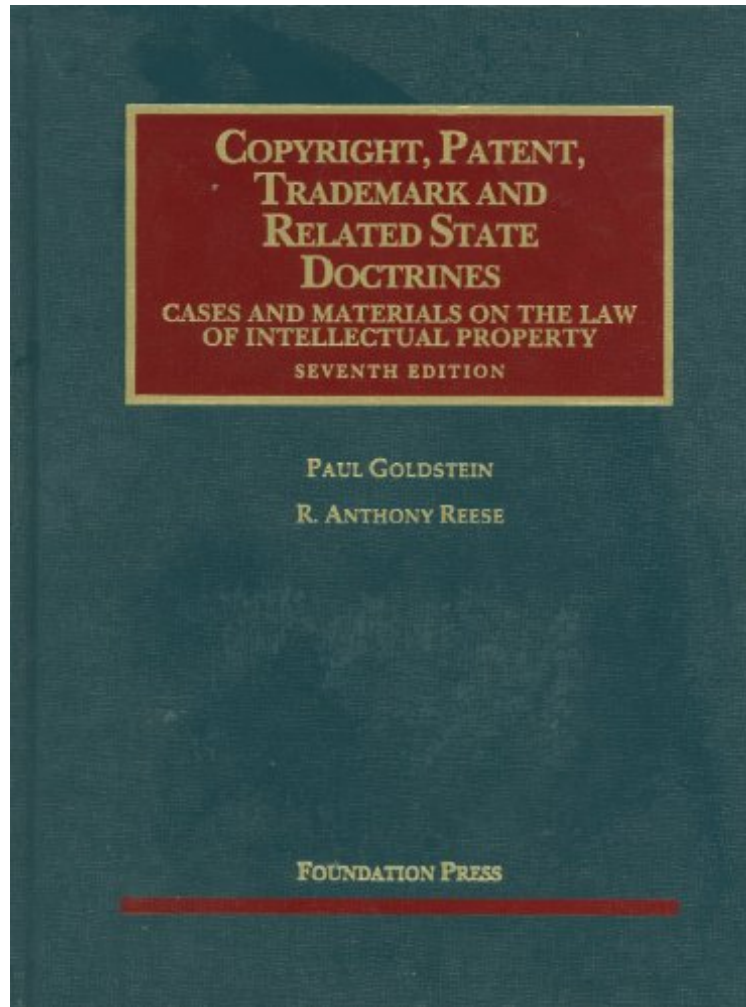

There are two things to think about when reviewing casebooks: whether it is the publisher or the author. The issues with this casebook was that the case index was in the front of the book, while the topic index was in the back of the book. I found this to be inconvenient; I also first thought there was no case index, until I stumbled upon it. Also, the cases index was incomplete and sometimes incorrect. I am not sure if this was a publisher or author issue but it should be taken care of. Students rely on indices when utilizing the casebook. The topical index in the back, was sorted well and helpful to me. The text of the book was a good size and the pages were a nice white, although not too firm. If you highlight, it will go through the pages more often than other publisher textbooks I have experienced.

This Edition comprehensively updates the previous Edition to take account of recent legislative, judicial and scholarly developments in all of intellectual property law and includes idea protection, trade secrets, right of publicity, designs and computer software--with attention to the patent law changes wrought by the America Invents Act. The casebook provides materials covering First Amendment limitations on I.P. rights, addresses emerging trends in Lanham Act section 43(a) and newly revised provisions of federal anti-dilution law. Other topics include Internet and domain names, secondary liability, safe harbors, and anti-circumvention provisions; expanded coverage of software protection and business method patents; and notes on comparative I.P. doctrines.
